This year Miras International School celebrates its 15th anniversary. Today in our school there are 642 students from 24 countries and an international team of teachers. The school has been accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (USA) and authorized for all IB programmes as well as has the status of an International Baccalaureate school. Our graduates receive the staterecognized education certificates and the internationally accepted IB MYP certificates and IB Diploma.

There will be reaccreditation of the school by CIS/NEASC. From November 8 to 14 a team of 11 specialists, administrators of different schools around the world and NEASC representatives will be working at our school. Good luck to all of us.

The development of the secondary school multilingual model is under way. In the primary and secondary schools students obtain extra support in learning English as a foreign language.

I would like to share joyful news: at the beginning of the school year there was a qualifying round of the international competition in mathematics. Our grade 6 student Aisha Dyussupova won it. She with a group of students will go to Bali for the next round of the competition and represent the Republic of Kazakhstan. Good luck, Aisha! In September our children showed themselves successfully at the international conference of UNESCO. Also the participation in international competitions on different subjects has been scheduled for the 1st semester.

We congratulate the new members of PTA and the Student Council. We wish you successful work in this academic year. Let me express my deep gratitude to all parents for their cooperation and support of the school's positive image.

until the holiday which begins on Monday October 20 and lasts until students return to school on Monday October 27. Please make a concerted effort to have your child in school every day of the scheduled Academic Calendar.

In the 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grades we have begun a new model, whereby able students in RTS and KTS take some of their classes (ICT, drama/music and Science) in another stream (RTS/ETS) as a means of strengthening language ability as well as transitioning to another stream. Some KTS students are making similar transitions in grades 9 and 11 in an effort to strengthen their ability to succeed on the UNT.

Already the students are busy with school activities both inside and outside the building including The Apple Action CAS and service project, Student Council, boys football/soccer, girls soccer, The University admissions Fair, the Alice in Wonderland IB project, badminton, MUN (Model United Nations), computer club, planning of the Hong Kong trip and much more!

During the last two academic years the primary school teachers have been working on more comprehensive and age-appropriate sets of ATL skills for each grade level which allow for consistent and continuous development of social, research, thinking, communication and self-management skills. This work also enables teachers to better monitor, assess and plan further activities for students more efficiently. The students reflect on and assess themselves against specific skills and set short and long-term goals.

Within the first term of this academic year the teachers have been discussing and collecting strategies and tools for the development of ATL skills in the Primary School. The list of strategies and tools will be collated and shared with the school community in Term Two.

As you may be aware, the International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme has undergone recent changes. The goals of these changes include making the MYP more streamlined, homogenous, and easily understood.

Additionally, The Next Chapter will bring the MYP more closely into line with the PYP and Diploma Programmes, enabling greater continuity across the IB continuum and facilitating the step up into IB Diploma.

Some of the changes include:

- An updated IB Learner Profile, representing more diversity (while maintaining the same ten traits);
- Revision of all subject guides;
- Revision and streamlining of subject objectives and assessment criteria;

- Removal of the Areas of Interaction, to be replaced by the Global contexts;
- Revision of the unit and vertical planning processes.

# School Dress Code, Electronic Pass, and PE Kit

As per the Student Code of Conduct, students are required to follow the school dress code, electronic pass, and PE kits requirements as stated below:

### **Dress Code**

The Mission and Philosophy of Miras International School are oriented to harmonious development of educated students responsible, respectful and able to cooperate with others. Dress code of Miras International School students should meet the safety and health standards and promote the learning process.

### Girls

Tartan Skirt\*

Blue Jacket\*

Blue woolen waistcoat (sleeveless jumper)\*

Blue woolen jumper\*

This must be accompanied by <u>single-colored black or dark brown</u> <u>shoes</u> and a white shirt or blouse (plain with no colours or patterns).

In colder weather, only black, white, navy (dark) blue or skin color tights may be worn.

### Boys

Grey classic trousers\*

Blue Jacket\*

Blue woolen waistcoat (sleeveless jumper)\*

Blue woolen jumper\*

This must be accompanied by single-colored black or brown shoes and a white classic shirt (plain with no colors or patterns).

For all students in cold weather students must change their outside boots for inside black shoes before lessons.

# Appropriate attire for PE, dance and swimming classes:

**PE class:** appropriate sport footwear, shorts/tracksuit, T-shirt

(house t-shirt if the student has been issued one).

• **Swimming class:** swimsuit/swimming trunks, swimming cap

**Dance class:** shorts/skirt/gymnastics suit, dance shoes

On non-uniform days students must adhere to the usual dress code as per the code of conduct.

If a doctor has recommended the use of special shoes (e.g. softer material) these must also be black.

### **Electronic passes**

The electronic passes system was introduced to improve safety standards and antiterrorist protection. Each school student, teacher and employee must have his/her pass card on them for registration of their presence in the Miras School grounds. A free pass card is given to students only once. If a pass is lost, it can be re-issued after a fee is paid to the school Accounts Department.

It is STRICTLY prohibited to give a pass card to a third person.

Those who are late for study or work must only enter through the central doors of the school.

# Miras in Wonderland

An interesting interdisciplinary project in Miras DP G11

Miras Diploma Programme students have experienced a new interdisciplinary project – ALICE IN MIRASLAND. It was based on the immortal books by Lewes Carrol Alice in Wonderland and Through the Looking Glass. The objectives were for the students to develop their ATL skills - research, communication.

presentation, and team-

work.

The project itself lasted one week though the preparations commenced a week earlier. The project week witnessed various events centered around the theme of the books. Through the week there were questions/answers competition for grades 6-12, and picture and costume competitions. The school was decorated with famous quotations from the books in three languages.

The project culminated on Friday as a proper atmosphere was created in the morning with the Disney cartoon about Alice playing on the big TV in the Atrium accompanied by the soundtrack of the famous Russian audio show created back in the 70s. Many students came dressed up as the characters from the books: Mad Hatters, White Rabbits, Red Queen, and, certainly, a few Alices. Miras miraculously transformed into the Wonderland!

The main event of the project was the presentations by the DP students of G11. The topics included symmetry, logic, wordplay, and physics inconsistencies.

Teachers of different subjects have been involved in the preparation and the supervision of the project Elena (Russian A Literature), Igor (Math SL/HL), Anna (Physics SL/HL), Dana (Chemistry SL/HL), Bolsyn (Art). Olga and Aigul provided musical and decoration support.

It was a wonderful opportunity for the whole school to be immersed in an atmosphere of a fairy-tale and to support the seniors. For DP G11 students it was their first encoun-

ter with research work and an integrated project at the DP level. Certainly, other projects will be more traditionally academic and perhaps with less of a fairytale in them, but all participants enjoyed working and more importantly **enjoyed learning** on the project. We want to wish our DP students joy in their further studies and to see

## From the Student Guidance Counselor

### From the Counselor:

My role in the school covers a diverse range of responsibilities: university admissions, pastoral care, career advice, parent liaison, teacher and more. My office is located on the ground floor of the new building room 134, near the IB Coordinator's office. and .

The first issue I wish to highlight is the need for students to have a proficiency in English qualification a requirement B for study in the United Kingdom, the United States of America, New Zealand and Australia.

Students from all non-English speaking countries are required to prove proficiency in English, and universities maintain the right to test applicants. Ideally this qualification should be obtained towards the end of year 11 as both tests scores are valid for two years.

Possession of successful results on IELTS, TOEFL or another legitimate international test of English Proficiency is a requirement for study in the United Kingdom and the USA for most International students.

In <u>some</u> instances this requirement is waived for a score of 5 (of 7) on IB English A HL or 6 (of 7) on English A SL

### Applying to the USA

US colleges and universities require that all their applicants take one or more standardized tests. These tests usually include the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language), and the SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test) or ACT test. Although the PSAT is not a required admissions test, it is highly recommended that students take it in year 10 as preparation for the SAT test in year 11.

### What is IELTS?

IELTS, the International English Language Testing System, is designed to assess the language ability of candidates who need to study or work where English is the language of communication.

IELTS is jointly managed by the University of Cambridge ESOL Examinations (Cambridge ESOL), British Council and IDP: IELTS Australia. IELTS conforms to the highest international standards of language assessment. IELTS is recognised by universities and employers in many countries, including Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the UK and the USA. It is also recognised by professional bodies, immigration authorities and other government agencies.
